The AIDC prides itself as a world-class organization which specializes in Skills Development and Training, Enterprise Development, Incubation programme, Management of Incentive Programme, and offers state-of-the-art manufacturing support facilities throughout the Gauteng Province.

In 2016, one of the Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEM) based in Rosslyn, expressed an interest in establishing a Vehicle Mobile Servicing Unit (MSU) businesses as an option for enterprise development programme, in response the AIDC commissioned a study to establish the feasibility of Mobile vehicle servicing units in the Province to support start-up B-BBEE companies, whilst addressing the Gauteng Provincial government's drive of enforcing Township Economy revitalisation across the province.

The mobile vehicle servicing units' concept refers to a vehicle servicing that is rendered from any location (i.e. home, office, roadside etc.) through a professional technician whose workshop is installed at the back of a bakkie or a panel van, allowing the technician to drive to the work site, as opposed to a fixed location workshop. These services are normally treated as extended customer convenience interventions by an existing fixed location workshop.

The mobile vehicle servicing unit business owner/operator will be allocated a fully kitted mobile vehicle servicing unit vehicle to assist as a tool of trade. Preference will be given to historically disadvantaged individuals and Gauteng-based candidates.
