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A4. TERMS OF REFERENCE AND SCOPE OF WORK

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. Mandate

The Automotive Industry Development Centre (AIDC) serves to develop the automotive manufacturing sector to globally competitive standards of excellence, through a world-class value proposition that enables effective and sustainable socio-economic growth. The organization was established as a government support centre, to increase the local automotive industry's global competitiveness and to promote Gauteng as the automotive industry investment destination of choice.

The organization is the dedicated developmental agency of the Gauteng Growth and Development Agency (GGDA) in relation to the specific industrial, infrastructure and training needs required by the automotive and allied sector - particularly those based in the Gauteng province.

The AIDC is thus tasked by GGDA with special developmental-oriented projects aimed at retaining and attracting investments in the automotive and allied-related sector with a focus on enterprise development, supporting BBBEE SMME development, skills development, and limited logistical infrastructure in line with the Gauteng provincial government's objectives of transformation, modernization, and re-industrialization (TMR). The AIDC also undertakes projects related to the transport and energy sectors, as well as the development of the Auto City in the Northern Corridor.

1.2. Vision

To be the automotive industry's thought leader and centre of excellence that promotes industry sustainability and global competitiveness.

1.3. Mission


Navigating the automotive industry's journey towards being an innovative and transformed sector, by providing agile, reliable, and responsive industry solutions.

1.4. Values

The AIDC's staff aligns their behaviour to the company's shared values as listed below, which support, and is informed by, the organisation's vision and mission:

- Open and honest two-way communication
- Encouraging a learning culture
- On-time, on-brief, on-budget

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1.5. Introduction and Background to the Tender

The AIDC jointly with CSIR and GGDA, plan to host the EV Summit 2024 during August 2024. The event is planned to address challenges and opportunities within the EV space in South Africa, based on the white paper produced by the DTIC. Hosting this event will require competent and experienced conference, exhibitions event management service providers to provide turnkey solution.

The DTIC published a White Paper on EV's [Electric Vehicles] during November 2023. Several round tables have been hosted by industry organisations (NAAMSA and AIDC-EC). Some studies have been conducted by government and private organisations on EV positioning for the country, but no direct way forward as to what potential benefits for the RSA market in terms of component manufacturing and aftermarket support (charging stations, skills development, and training). This summit aims to provide a platform for further discussions, knowledge sharing and interventions in SA and showcasing of commodities in the exhibition by suppliers and service providers within the EV space.

The summit will focus on the enablement and manufacturing of EV's and commodities, especially within Gauteng Province. Therefore, AIDC and partners need to engage with relevant stakeholders in the EV space and manufacturing to enable manufacturing and introduction of required EV commodities and services.


The EV Summit 2024 event will be hosted over 3 days at the CSIR in Pretoria and will be interactive to allow dialogue and to share best practises and input from key stakeholders. The engagements are critical to seek a way forward for the implementation of EV manufacturing in South Africa.

1.6. Scope of Work

Hosting the event will require competent and experienced conference, exhibitions event management service providers especially those with experience to host conferences, trade shows and exhibition including staging gala dinners within the conferences / show. The service provider/bidder to manage event through self-funding model / revenue generation model, where funds / costs to fund event requirements and logistics plan and logistics will be generated by conference, exhibition and gala dinner sale of packages to companies and individuals. Research was done to establish estimated costs of hosting such an event, which will be used as guideline to generate revenue for the EV Summit to settle required cost of event.

The role and responsibilities of the service provider will be but not limited to below:

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1.6.1. Management of venue and Catering Services

- Ensure all venues are set up for different events and coordinate all required catering jointly with CSIR for all areas. CSIR to provide venue but bidder to ensure such venue is formally booked for the event.

1.6.2. Full Conference & Exhibition Event Management

- Source all service providers to render exhibition stand building service, including furniture, lighting, and all related exhibition requirements for customers:
 - 3x3m shell scheme stand (non-branded)
 - 1 Power plug
 - 1 table and 2 chairs
 - Lighting
 - Carpet flooring.
 - Fascia (Company name branding one side)
- Conference requirements including delegate and speaker gifts selection and procurement.
- Gala Dinner and related requirements, sound, and PA systems for 250 people:
 - Source live band entertainment - play music (arrival and during event – 5 hours)
- Provide online and onsite registration system with QR code functionality including printing of branded name tags with QR code and lanyards.
- Design of digital marketing materials for electronic lighting
- Provide design and printing of the following branded material:
 - A5 Summit booklet x 1000 copies printed.
 - Standard Pullup banners x 40
 - Standard Wall banners x 2
 - Standard Teardrop x 30
- Promote sales of conference, exhibition, and gala dinner through corporate and individual packages
- Event Concept development, plan, and manage all logistics (branding conceptualising and application) and other requirements of EV SUMMIT 2024 on behalf of the AIDC.
- Schedule and attend all pre-event committee and sub-committee meetings to discuss progress.
- Develop detailed project plan with all deliverables per the scope of work, and timelines agreed with AIDC.
- Co-ordination and management of speaker & high-profile guests' participation including interviews.
- Recording of the three-day events activities, and compile close-out report to be submitted to AIDC within (1) month after the event.
- Manage sponsorship packages and related deliverables as per sponsorship commitments.

- 4.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful service provider shall furnish to the client the performance security of the amount specified in SCC
- 4.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the client as compensation for any loss resulting from the service provider's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 4.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the client and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - 4.3.1 a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the client's country or abroad, acceptable to the client, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the client; or
 - 4.3.2 a cashier's or certified cheque

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4.4 The performance security will be discharged by the client and returned to the service provider not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the service provider's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

5. Insurance

5.1 The service rendered under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC. The contractor will ensure that the insurance liability cover is adequate. Proof of insurance shall be submitted within 7 days of issue of letter of appointment.

6. Payment

- 6.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the service provider under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 6.2 Monthly payment for the goods and services as per tender scope.
- 6.3 Payment will be made in South African Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.
- 6.4 It is the requirement of AIDC for the successful bidder to maintain a valid Tax Compliance status and a valid CSD Status (National Treasury CSD Number must be provided) for the duration of the project. Therefore, a new valid Tax Compliance must be provided upon expiry of the previous one. The Tax Status will continuously be checked on SARS on-line system during the duration of the contract.

7. Prices

7.1 Prices charged by the service provider for services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the service provider in his bid, except for any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the client's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.


8. Assignment

- 8.1 The service provider shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with AIDC's prior written consent.
- 8.2 AIDC on the other hand will in due course have the right to assign its contract with the service provider to another legal entity owned by the Gauteng Provincial Government. Due written notice will in such an instance be provided to the service provider.

9. Subcontracts

9.1 The Service Provider shall not subcontract work without the prior written consent of AIDC.

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10 Early Termination


- 1.1. The AIDC can provide a 30-day notice period for earlier termination if the AIDC needs to participate in a transversal contract from Treasury, DED or GGDA on an earlier date than this contract's end date.
